God's Goodness to Israel

Thanksgiving Psalms

- "A prayer expressing gratitude; a public acknowledgment or celebration of divine goodness."
- Lacking in today's society
- The psalmists understood so well how to express their gratitude to God
- This group of psalms thanks specifically for God's goodness to Israel

Lessons for Today

- A thankful attitude is so needed today. Let us teach our children and grandchildren to be thankful.
- We should thank God for His righteous judgment; it gives meaning and purpose to a godly life.

Thanksgiving Psalms

- Psalm 21
 - The nation's thanksgiving and hope for its king (Vv. 1-2)
- Psalm 36
 - The Lord's mercy and lovingkindness (Vv. 5-9)
- Psalm 46
 - God is our refuge and strength (Vv. 1, 10, 11)
- Psalm 48
 - Great is the Lord, the refuge of Zion (Vv. 1-3)
- Psalm 68
 - Blessed by the God who marches on to victory! (Vv. 1-3, 19, 34-35)

Thanksgiving Psalms

- Psalm 87
 - The glories of the city of God (Vv. 1-3)
- Psalm 124
 - Thanksgiving for national deliverance (Vv. 1-5)
- Psalm 126
 - The Lord has done great things for us (Vv. 1-2)
- Psalm 129
 - The wicked have not prevailed against us because the Lord is righteous (Vv. 1-4)
- Psalm 149
 - Praise the Lord for the salvation of the humble (Vv. 3-4)



Question 3 - This psalm is filled with exuberant praise and thanksgiving. What is the reason for this praise? How often do we give thanks to God for the same thing?

- For His righteous judgment
- Not often if at all

- Time of writing
 - Deliverance from Babylonian captivity see Isaiah 40-66 (per Leupold)
 - Or, author is David; some view this group of psalms (95 - 100) to be of the same writer - see Psa. 95 and Heb. 4:7 (per Spurgeon).
- "Exuberant praise for God's righteous judgment."

Psalm 98 - "Exuberant praise for God's righteous judgment"

Outline

- A call to praise God for a mighty work done in Israel. (Vv. 1-3)
- How this praise is to be given. (Vv. 4-6)
- A call to all nature to give praise. (Vv. 7-8)
- The occasion for all this thanksgiving is stated -God's righteous judgment. (V. 9)

Question 4 - Find a recurring phrase in this psalm. Is this same admonition needed today?

 "Oh, that men would give thanks to the Lord for His goodness, and for His wonderful works to the children of men." (vv. 8, 15, 21, 31)

Question 5 – Who does the Lord deliver from trouble, affliction, etc.?

Those who cry out to the Lord

- Vv. 1-3 the call to give thanks.
 - Israel had been redeemed
 - Called on to express thanks
- Vv. 4-32 an illustration
 - Four sections that present the restoration figuratively in four different life situations

Psalm 107 - "Praise for Restoration"

Illustrations of Restoration:

- Like a caravan lost in the wilderness and straying about aimlessly, but is led out (vv. 4-9)
- Like an imprisonment, but the chains are broken (vv. 10-16)
- Like a recovery from a severe illness (vv. 17-22)
- Like the deliverance of a ship at sea from the dangers of a great storm which threatened the life of all aboard (vv. 23-32)

Psalm 107 - "Praise for Restoration"

- Vv. 33-43 a summary of the truths of the psalm
 - God rules over all and is in control
 - He makes blessings abound in every respect
 - Can make the wicked despair and the righteous proper
 - Even the lowly and poor are made to prosper in the Lord
 - V. 43 The wise will observe all this and understand God's lovingkindness

Question 6 - In one phrase, what is the psalmist giving thanks to God for?

- "For His mercy endures forever."
- "faithfulness" NASV
- "steadfast love" ESV
- "faithful love" CSB
- "chesedh" no English equivalent
- Koenig calls it "covenant-faithfulness"
- Writer unknown, but note 2 Chron. 7:3,6

Psalm 136 - "God's Enduring Kindness"

Outline (Spurgeon)

- Three-fold praise to the Lord (vv. 1-3)
- Six notes of praise to the Creator (vv. 4-9)
- Six more upon deliverance from Egypt (vv. 10-15)
- Seven upon the journey through the wilderness and the entrance into Canaan (vv. 16-22)
- Two happy verses of personal gratitude for present mercy (vv. 23-24)
- One to tell of the Lord's universal providence (v. 25)
- Closing verse to excite never-ending praise (v. 26)

Psalm 136 - "God's Enduring Kindness"

Outline (Leupold)

- A call to give thanks (vv. 1-3)
- 1st motivation God's works as Creator (vv. 4-9)
- 2nd motivation God's control of the realm of nature in deliverance (vv. 10-15)
- 3rd motivation His deliverance of His people (vv. 16-24)
- 4th motivation His universal providence (v. 25)
- The original call repeated (v. 26)

Psalm 81 "A plea to remain faithful to the Lord"

Outline

- A call to observe a festival (vv. 1-5)
- An admonition not to have any other gods before the Lord (vv. 6-10)
- A motivation for this; God's punishment of Israel's sin (vv. 11-16)
